HOPE IN THE MIDST OF TRIBULATION

My friends join me in contemplating the presence of the Lord in the Holy Scripture today thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel Jesus Reminds his disciples, "Be watchful because no one knows the time when the Son of Man would come." His speech evokes the images that may be found in the book of Daniel. a great tribulation will come after which the Son of Man will descend from the clouds, sending out his angels and gathering his elect. Then Jesus invites them to learn from a fig tree by knowing the summer is near, the branches are tender and leaves have sprout. he is telling them to discern God's message in the signs of the times.

The image of hope is encapsulated in the figure of Michael, the archangel, the messenger of God, the guardian of his people and he comes to offer hope to those who persistent in wisdom and justice yet persecuted. Those who persecuted others on this earth choosing the part of injustice, they are in everlasting horror and disgrace. Not only the holy men and women faced persecution and injustice but our Lord Jesus Christ as well. He being our High Priest, suffered, died on the cross so that we may have life. there is a promise that do not be afraid, when the Son of Man will to do judgment. who will survive the judgment: those who persisted in justice and wisdom following God, but those who enjoyed power and abuse of power on this earth, will live in horror and disgrace. There is Hope but there is also Judgment. Jesus Christ persecuted, put to death, silenced but now is seated at the right hand of the Father enjoying all the authority in heaven and on earth and is the source of salvation for all sinners.
