
Around the Board Room

Youth – There's a class for everyone! Get your child involved in church activities at an early age. We have wonderful, caring teachers who make religious education well, educational, but also fun!





Did you know?

The Lamb of God that we say during the Mass comes from the theological concept of Lamb of God or Agnus Dei. It's referenced by John the Baptist in John 1:29 to Jesus, "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin or the world." Although we sing it, it's also a stand-alone song. Here is the Latin translation:

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, miserere nobis. Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.


Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, dona nobis pacem. Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Your Church Face

Health News Tidbits

- Seniors who use computers are less likely to experience depression.
- Don't ignore chest pain! Women can and usually have different symptoms when having a heart attack than men. Some symptoms are very vague: unusual fatigue and weakness, pain in the neck, jaw, back and shoulder (not so much in the chest like men), nausea, vomiting, indigestion, and shortness of breath. Immediate treatment is to take 1 aspirin (can't be ibuprofen but any brand of aspirin will do) and head to the nearest Emergency Room (don't drive yourself) or call 911 depending on the severity of your symptoms.
- An outside temperature of 0° F and a wind speed of 15 mph = wind chill temperature of -19° F. Under these conditions, exposed skin (besides toes and fingers, think your face especially the tip of your nose and ear lobes) can freeze in 30 min. You start to lose feeling and the areas turn pale or white. Treatment: rewarm the area SLOWLY. Dress for the cold weather but wear a hat (remember kerchiefs or babushkas still available online) and cover your mouth with a scarf to protect your nose and lungs. Mittens are better than gloves in keeping your fingers warm. Where to find mittens for adults? Kids size?


